Over 149,000 pupil premium children are estimated to be having an NSBP breakfast on an average school day *

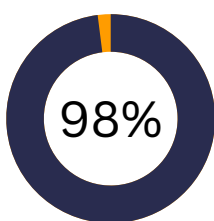


94%
Of Headteachers say they have seen a reduction in inappropriate food coming into school since starting the NSBP **

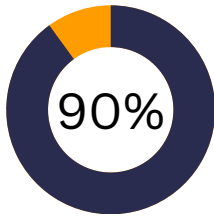
Most Headteachers reported they had seen a big improvement or some improvement in the following areas **

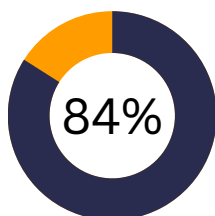

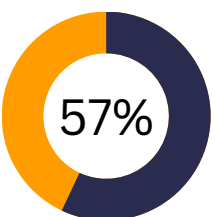

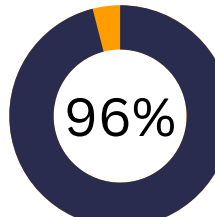
