Getting involved





There are a few simple ways to get involved in the Toy Appeal:

1. Classic Toy Appeal - Buy individual presents

You could choose and buy presents for the children and families you have been matched with. Why not get your friends or colleagues involved by creating a wish list and asking them to buy a present each? We will work with you to arrange delivery to the families.

2. Extending the Magic - Donate practical family items

We support thousands of families each year via our FOOD Clubs, providing affordable food sources to those experiencing food insecurity. This year, we would like to add some 'non-essential' festive cheer to the weekly box before Christmas. We are looking for bulk donations e.g. a family board game, supermarket voucher, sweet treats.

3. Fundraise - Raise money for the Toy Appeal

There are two options, you can pool together monetary donations that you could use to buy presents. Or, alternatively, you could fundraise to go towards our bigger pot to support our families this Christmas and beyond. These are fantastic options for organisations that have offices spread across the country or have many colleagues working from home.

4. Mix and Match

You could choose to buy presents and fundraise, helping us to support even more children and their families during the festive period.



How to take part

Step 1: Register your interest & desired level of involvement

We will ask you to confirm your location, some contact details and your desired level of involvement. We will then personally reach out to you to discuss details further, to make sure the plan is right for you.

Step 2: Your perfect match...

Depending on your desired type of involvement, we will:

- Match you with a Family Action service that has requested gifts based on the information you have provided, geographical proximity and overall suitability. We will provide you with details about your match – including a breakdown of the children and young people they work with by age and gender, and a little about the work they do.
- Match you with local Family Action FOOD Clubs to support you to extend the magic to whole households at Christmas time.
- Match you with a member of the Toy Appeal team who will be able to offer you some advice and guidance around fundraising for Family Action.





Step 3: Shopping and fundraising time!

If you're planning on buying your own gifts and involving friends or colleagues, here are some ideas on how to allocate who buys what:

- Let those who want to take part pull an age and gender out of a hat, and ask them to buy a gift for that child.
- Write all the ages and genders out on gift tags and hang them on your Christmas tree or noticeboard. Those who want to take part can take a tag and buy a gift for that child.

Once you have collected all the gifts, it is up to you to wrap them. Remember to add a tag or note down what is in the gift!

If you're fundraising to buy gifts, donations can be collected from colleagues using <u>GiftRound</u> which you can then use to buy presents.

Step 4: Arrange Delivery

It is up to you to arrange a mutually suitable time to drop off the gifts, depending on the Family Action service you're working with. If you are buying and sending gifts online, please coordinate deliveries to arrive on the date(s) requested by the service. Services may be unable to receive multiple deliveries from couriers.

FAQs





Q. How do we buy gifts?

This is up to you! A few ideas...

- Each member of staff buys a present
- Money pool in your office and buy all the presents in one go
- Set a company budget to purchase the presents

Q. What can I buy?

We ask you to spend around £10-£15 on a new present (not second-hand) as many of the children we work with do not have the privilege of opening something new that belongs to them alone, so this is important to them.



Q. Are there any presents we can't buy?

We ask that you refrain from buying:

- Toys or games suggesting aggression or violence; we work with many children who have been exposed to the above at a young age
- Sweets or other edible items unless requested specifically by a service
- Anything that assumes the family to have something for the toy to be of use (e.g. a DVD, video game or toy requiring batteries)
- Anything including blades or sharps e.g. scissors, sharpeners

Q. We are a large company with multiple offices, can they all get involved?

Yes! We have projects all over England and we would be delighted to match you to more than one.

FAQs continued

Q. How do the presents get delivered and when?

Once you are matched to a Family Action service we will give you the date(s) you need to make/arrange the delivery.

Q. Shall we wrap and label the presents?

This depends on the wishes of the service you are matched with. Some services prefer the presents wrapped while others prefer them unwrapped. To help us distribute your gift to the child who would love it the most please label all gifts with age, gender and a brief description of the contents.
